4.2.2 Entry Procedure

Those wishing to take part in Central Rally Aichi/Gifu 2019 must register and fill in the entry form along with the documents shown below duly completed and send them to the Management Office via FAX or email before the closing date for entries (no postal mail accepted).

Image data of the driver, co-driver and vehicle to take part in the rally must be emailed before the closing date for entries.

The participant agreement on the entry form must be duly signed and, in conformity with the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, the original copy shall arrive at the Organiser within 5 days of the closing date for entries.

The entry will only be accepted if accompanied by the following documents:

- · A set of entry forms
- · Promotional information
- · Entry booklet / a set of application forms
- · On-board camera application
- Photocopy of the vehicle inspection certificate (those registered in Japan)
- A Carnet de Passages en Douane from the ASN of which the vehicle is registered in (those temporarily imported to Japan)
- Photocopy of the automobile insurance policy valid for the rally competition or rally insurance application
- Image data of the driver, co-driver and vehicle to take part in
- · Participant agreement

4.3 Number of Entries Accepted and Classes

4.3.1 Number of Entries Accepted

The maximum number of entrants will be 90 (including the National Class).

According to the FIA International Sporting Code, Art. 3.14.1, the Organiser reserves the right to refuse entries and notify the applicant of such refusal within 2 days of the closing date for entries.

If more than 90 entries are received the acceptance of entries will be at the sole discretion of the Organiser.

Anyone whose licence has been issued outside Japan must obtain an authorisation from their ASN or an ASN's approval seal (stamp) on their entry form.

4.3.2 Classes

FIA International Rally

Cars eligible to enter this class are those conforming to the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 4 and the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations V4 (APRC), Art. 4 (incl. those eligible national/regional cars). Classes of cars will be shown on the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 4.

4.6 Refund

Entry fees will be full refunded in case:

- 1) your entry has not been accepted; or
- 2) the rally has not taken place
- * Those who are unable to take part in the rally due to unforeseen circumstances beyond his/her control (provided that his/her ASN gives legitimacy to the non-participation) will receive 50% refund.

5 Insurance

All competition cars registered outside Japan shall carry compulsory third party insurance (jibaiseki) and voluntary bodily injury/property damage insurance that will be effective throughout the event. Within the scope of each provision shown below, the competition cars registered outside Japan and their crew members are covered by the insurance arranged by the Organiser. * All figures are converted at 110JPY into a USD.

5.1 Special Stages

Coverages for Special Stage spectators are as follows.

- 1) Death: up to 100,000,000JPY (equivalent to 953,000USD)
- 2) Hospitalisation: 7,500JPY per day (72USD/day) *Maximum 180 days from the day of the accident
- 3) Outpatient treatment: 5,000JPY per day (47USD/day)
 - *Maximum 90 days within 180 days from the day of the accident

5.2 Liaison

Coverages for public liability (bodily injury/property damage) on road sections are as follows.

- 1) Death/injury: unlimited
- 2) Property damage: up to 5,000,000JPY (48,000USD) *Accidents on Special Stages will also be covered.
- 3) Passenger: up to 5,000,000JPY (48,000USD)
 - *Hospitalisation will be covered maximum 180 days from the day of the accident.
 - *Outpatient treatment will be covered maximum 90 days within 180 days from the day of the accident.

The coverage of the Organiser-arranged insurance will come into effect at the start of LEG1 and cease at the finish or at the moment of retirement or exclusion. Service vehicles, including those bearing official plates issued by the Organiser, will never be considered as official participants of the rally, thus they are not covered under the insurance policy of the rally and will remain sole responsibility of each owner.









5.3 Rally Cars Registered in Japan

All competition vehicles registered in Japan must be covered by voluntary third party insurance valid for the entire rally competition. The insurance must cover at least:

- 1) Death/injury: up to 20,000,000JPY (180,000USD) or over
- 2) Property damage: 2,000,000 (18,000USD) or over
- 3) Passenger: 10,000,000JPY (91,000USD) or over
 - *JMRC mutual aid system (solatium) can be used for Passenger insurance.

The insurance above can also be arranged by the rally secretariat. Download the application form from the website.

5.4 Insurance for Team Members (except crew)

Coverages for public liability (bodily injury/property damage) on road sections are as follows.

- 1) Death: up to 10,000,000JPY (91,000USD)
- 2) Hospitalisation: 5,000JPY per day (45USD/day) *Maximum 180 days from the day of the accident
- 3) Premium is 550JPY (5USD) per person which is valid for one week.

6 Advertising and Identification

6.1 Windows

Advertising is allowed on the car body including the roof while those on top of the front windscreen is allowed only on the cars registered outside Japan. The advert size must be 10cm or smaller in height from the top edge of the front windscreen, and 8cm or smaller in height from the top edge of the rear windscreen.

6.2 Restrictions

There are no restrictions on advertising, including those of alcoholic beverages and tobacco, to be affixed on the competition cars and team wears.

6.3 Rally Plates and Identification

The Organiser will provide each crew with a set of a rally plate and identification numbers in accordance with the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art.18 and 19. As detailed on the Appendix 4, they must be affixed to their car in the positions prior to scrutineering and must be visible for the duration of the rally. A fine of 54,000JPY will be imposed on violators.

7 Tyres

7.1 Permitted Tyres

No studded tyres are permitted in this rally.

7.2 Tyre Quantities

No restrictions are placed on the maximum quantity of tyres.

8 Fuel

No leaded petrol are allowed in this event. Levels of lead will be checked in JIS K2255 test.

Competitors may use FIA fuel conforming to the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 252.9. The FIA fuel shall be arranged by the competitors themselves and bring it to the designated location.

Between the close of scrutineering and the rally finish, refuelling can be done at the designated petrol stations shown on the Road Book.









9 Reconnaissance

- **9.1** Reconnaissance will take place on Thursday 7 and Friday 8 November for competition crew under the Organiser's control.
- **9.2** Reconnaissance registrations open along with administrative checks at Rally HQ on Wednesday 6 November between 15:00 and 19:30, and Thursday 7 November between 8:00 and 9:00. Each crew must receive a "recce card" and a "vehicle identification card" upon completion of registration.
- **9.3** The reconnaissance schedule is shown on the Appendix 2.

9.4 Restrictions

- **9.4.1** Reconnaissance must be performed on a car with no livery.
- **9.4.2** Identification numbers must be affixed to the car during the course of reconnaissance.
- **9.4.3** Crews are authorised to drive a maximum of two passages on each special stage within the given time unless you make it to each stage before closing time. Special stages run twice are considered to be one special stage.

9.5 Traffic Rules

- 9.5.1 During reconnaissance, competitors must comply strictly with the road traffic laws and any further requirements of the Organiser as published on the Supplementary Regulations or in bulletins. At all times, the safety and rights of other road users must be respected. Officials may monitor the behaviour of competitors on the reconnaissance route with visual contact, measuring device, photograph and/or video. All offences will be reported to the Stewards who may impose a maximum penalty of refusal of rally start.
- **9.5.2** Speed limits as signposted on all roads used during reconnaissance must be observed. Failure to comply will result in a penalty to be imposed by the Stewards according to the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 20.2.

9.6 Tyres

Road-homologated series production tyres for asphalt must be used for reconnaissance.

10 Administrative Checks

10.1 Documents to be Presented

At administrative checks, the following documents will be checked and entry form details verified:

- 1) Driver's & co-driver's driving licences and competition licences
 - * Foreign drivers & co-drivers shall have valid driving licences (International Driving Permits) to drive on public roads in Japan.
- 2) Competitor/entrant licence
- 3) Medical certificate for FIA International Rally participants
- 4) Authorisation for foreign drivers by their ASN to take part in this rally
- 5) Vehicle inspection certificate, compulsory third party insurance policy, and automobile insurance policy valid for this rally
- 6) A Carnet de Passages en Douane issued by ASN of which the vehicle is registered in *No vehicles imported in other ways than the above (such as ATA carnet) may take part in this rally.

10.2 Timetable

Administrative checks will take place at the Rally HQ on Wednesday 6 November between 15:00 and 19:30, and Thursday 7 November between 8:00 and 9:00.









11 Scrutineering, Sealing and Marking

11.1 Scrutineering Venue and Timetable

Venue Scrutineering Garage in Expo Park

Date Friday 8 November between 10:00 and 16:00

Marking of gearboxes and differentials (incl. spare ones) for all cars, and sealing of turbocharger for turbocharged cars will be performed at scrutineering in accordance with the communication schedule that will be issued before 8 November 2019.

11.2 Mud Flaps

Competition cars may be equipped with mud flaps in conformity to the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 252.7.7.

11.3 Windows/Nets

The use of silvered or tinted films on the side and on the rear window is authorised in accordance with the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 253.11.

11.4 Crew's Safety Equipment

All crew must come with homologated crash helmet, racing overall, underwear, gloves, shoes, balaclava and FHR (such as HANS). All those equipment must be presented for scrutineering to be checked for compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix L, Chapter III.

11.5 Noise Level

Temporarily imported cars must comply with the noise level regulations of the country which the car is registered in. Cars registered in Japan must be compliant with the Road Transport Vehicle Act, Art. 3.

11.6 National Requirements

Those wishing to use two-way radios must complete the application form on the Entry Booklet to be submitted to the Management Office by 7 September.

11.7 Emergency Stop Switch (Kill Switch)

All competition cars on the International Class must be equipped with an emergency stop (kill) switch that complies with the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 253.13.

11.8 Fire Extinguisher

All cars must be equipped with an extinguishing system in compliance with the FIA International Sporting Code, Appendix J, Art. 253.7.

11.9 Special Requirements

Each competition car must carry two red reflective triangles, flare, red beacon, tow rope, first aid kit, and a red "SOS" sign and on the reverse a green "OK" board in A3 format, all of which must be kept within easy reach.

11.10 Safety Tracking Equipment

All competition cars taking part in Central Rally Aichi/Giru 2019 must be equipped with a RallySafe safety tracking (GPS) system. All competitors must make provision in their cars for the installation of the system. Installation and operating instructions are available at www.rallysafe.com.au. The correct functioning and installation of the system will be checked at scrutineering.









RallySafe components consist of a main unit (monitor) and an antenna kit including antenna, brackets and cables. The main unit will be rented at the time of scrutineering while the antenna kit shall be arranged by the competitors themselves. The kit is available for purchase at:

The RallySafe main unit shall basically be collected at the entry of the final Parc Fermé. Remove the unit from the car at the final service and return it to a RallySafe staff at the Parc Fermé. In case you are unable to return the unit at the Parc Fermé due to retirement or any other incident, get it back to the rally secretariat at the HQ no later than Sunday 10 November at 19:00. Failure to do so may result in a return by international mail/courier at your own expense.

11.11 On-board Cameras

The entrant of any car which carries an on-board camera must make a prior application at the same time as your rally entry. Whether the camera is installed inside or out of the car, you are required to have it properly installed by the time of scrutineering. Authorised cameras will be identified by an adhesive decal. No unauthorised shooting allowed. All rights of the on-board camera footage are reserved by the Organiser and consequently the Organiser may demand submission of any such footage.

12 Other Procedures

12.1 Opening Ceremony and Photocall

The opening ceremony and photocall take place at Expo Park on Friday 8 November at 17:30 which are mandatory for all crew. No drivers briefings will be held in this rally.

12.2 Ceremonial Start

The ceremonial start held on Friday 8 November at 18:00 is mandatory for all crew. The drivers and codrivers must wear racing suits and perform the ceremonial start in accordance with instructions from rally officials. A detailed schedule will be published in a communication.

12.3 Start

12.3.1 Start order for the rally will be given on the Official Notice Board.

Publication of the LEG1 Start List Friday 8 November 16:45
Publication of the LEG2 Start List Saturday 9 November 20:30 (TBC)

12.3.2 As on the Start List, the interval between competitors selected by the Organiser will be two minutes while all others will be one minute.

12.4 Official Time used during the Rally

- **12.4.1** The official time during the rally will be JST (9 hours ahead of GMT).
- **12.4.2** Crews are authorised to check in before the due time without incurring any penalty at LEG1 TC6C and LEG 2 TC14A, whereas late arrival will incur a penalty.

12.5 Special Stages

- **12.5.1** The cars' times will be recorded to the 1/10th of a second.
- **12.5.2** The start and other signals will be given by an electronic digital countdown system. Details are shown on the Appendix 6.
- **12.5.3** SS3 & SS4 on LEG1 and SS10 & SS11 on LEG2 will be Super Special Stages conforming to the 2019 FIA Regional Rally Sporting Regulations, Art. 41. DNF will incur a penalty.









12.6 Restart after Retirement (Rally 2)

- **12.6.1** Any crew who has withdrewn from LEG1 may restart the next LEG as Rally 2 under condition of submitting "Rally 2 Application" to the Clerk of the Course no later than Saturday 9 November at 20:30.
- **12.6.2** Those availing of Rally 2 must present re-scrutineering sheet to the Chief Technical Officer to have their car re-scrutineered at least 60 minutes prior to the car's start time of LEG2. Authorisation will be given only to those who have passed re-scrutineering.
- 12.6.3 Rally 2 competitors will be included in the Final Classification with a 60-minute penalty.
- **12.6.4** Rally 2 cars' times on Special Stages will be recorded and officially published.

12.7 Podium Ceremony

The podium ceremony takes place at Expo Park on Sunday 10 November at around 18:04. Top three finishers in each class will claim a podium for a provisional prize-giving. All others are asked to pass through the podium.









Appendix 6 | Start Signal Sequences and Start Procedure



Five red lights are on 5 seconds prior to the start.



Four red lights are on 4 seconds prior to the start.



Three red lights are on 3 seconds prior to the start.



Two red lights are on 2 seconds prior to the start.



One red light is on 1 second prior to the start.



All the red lights are extinguished and one **GREEN** light is on to signal the start of the rally.

- In case a false start is detected,
 i.e. car passes the start line before the green light is given, the signals are FLASHING.
- In the event of the system failure, the start procedure will be performed manually by the start marshal's countdown aloud on a 30-15-10-5-4-3-2-1 sec basis.
- Start signals in SS11 and 12 may differ from those above.
